THE PASTOR'S PAGE

As I write this I am taking time away on a retreat away from home, away from the office, away from the church, in order to once again do some long range worship and sermon series planning. I plan to leave with sermons planned through 2009 and into 2010.

I always begin with prayer. I take walks where I sing, seek to clear my mind, and pray. Part of my prayer is to remind myself of all the prayers you've asked for over the last year. I keep track of these in written form as you have lifted them up before the congregation in worship. I also write down all the prayers we lift up at committee meetings or other gatherings. When I went back over these prayers over the last year, I am struck by how much you pray and about what you pray.

Here's what I discovered. Most of your prayers have to do with sickness, and the hope for healing. So many prayers have to do with cancer, surgeries, and death of loved ones. We've prayed a lot for people traveling, people in accidents, and those serving in the military. Just as often, we've prayed in thanksgiving for birthdays and births, anniversaries, gratitude for help, and for jobs lost and found. You've prayed in thanksgiving for our visitors, and often for our youth and their leaders. We've celebrated weddings, people involved in the wider community, and those who offer their gifts of music. We've prayed in response to the weather, both good and bad, and for those who have been victims of crime. And there are many more on the list!

This is who you are, or at least what you share. This is what I take to be upon your hearts, both in joy and in sorrow. And I've felt grateful to have been able to share those prayers with you, to do so once again today, and to feel drawn closer to you all who are the Body of Christ known as the Forest Grove United Methodist Church.

Prayer is my first instinct when there is extraordinary joy or sorrow, celebration or pain, love or anger. I'm grateful that God has given us the gift of prayer, and models from others of the many, many ways in which we can pray, like:

"Not my will but thine..."

"Our Father, who art in Heaven..."

As I am at this retreat, know that I have brought with me the church roster and have prayed for each and every one of you. It's a long list – thanks be to God!

As life goes on around you and in you, whether it's sickness or celebrations, financial concerns or other matters in the changing seasons of life, I urge you to pray. It's so easy. Here's how to start, with these words: "God,..." Then listen. Or listen first. You'll be amazed at what happens.

I thank those of you who have trusted us all with your prayers.

FROM THE ALTAR TO THE WORLD

It was a hot Sunday afternoon in 2005. I climbed aboard the “Sunday Rover” for a picturesque trip along the ridge tops of the Cotswold Hills from Gloucester, England, to Coleford, nestled in the hills near the Welsh border at the edge of the Forest of the Dean. I was in search of my roots. My paternal great grandparents emigrated from Coleford in 1879 when my grandmother was about 3. I don’t know much of their story and I was curious about how this visit might inform me. Coleford is a quiet, pleasant town, remote and difficult to get to. Its economy through the ages has been small farming, timber related work, and coal mining. My great grandfather worked as a carpenter and lost 3 fingers to a saw. There’s little evidence of wealth today and not much to see. I spent most of my time under the blazing sun in the cemetery.

A few days later when I had returned to Bristol I took the less than 10 minute train ride to Bath. Bath is a very old city that became the center of fashionable life in the 1700s and 1800s. The massive buildings are opulent and the thermal baths/spas catered to the rich upper classes of that era. Today is it a beautiful city and an expensive one to visit.

The contrast between humble Coleford and my roots, and Bath and the lifestyle of the English upper class was overwhelming. It surely clarified my forebears’ decision to emigrate. Isn’t poverty surrounded by great wealth one of the usual themes of immigration?

By the time you are reading this we, as a worshipping congregation, will be in the middle of Pastor Dan’s series on immigration in the Bible. I have three ideas for each of us in this time.

- I invite you to let your mind explore your own immigration roots.
- Then I invite you to bring your potluck dish on October 5th and stay after worship for a program given by Mira Conklin, Hispanic Ministry Developer in Western Washington County. Her subject is “Roots of Immigration.” She is well informed and has concrete experience to back it up.
- If you want to do some preparation ahead of time, visit her blog at www.LaTravesiaDeMira@blogspot.com where she tells of her Witness for Peace journey into Mexico, along the border, and a 70 mile walk across the Arizona desert.

MARATHON MUSINGS

Since I started training for the Portland Marathon, I've been putting a real strain on my body. My legs (in particular my left shin) threw up the white flag this week and not so kindly asked me to take some time off. So... I decided to park my running shoes for four days and focus instead on the mental aspect of pushing through 26.2 miles.

I practiced visualizing myself running effortlessly over the St. John's Bridge. I found a website with tips on things to think about during the run. I mapped out my splits. And I talked with Patti Rose.

She told me that when she and Dave were traveling in Europe last summer they were faced with a difficult decision. They had the option of either sleeping in a barn like they had intended to, or they could not sleep in a barn. They were exhausted, tired, weary, and they really didn't want to sleep in the barn. But because they told so many people back home that they were going to spend a night in the barn, they determined they would. The choice was clear cut for them; they could either say they spent a night in a barn or they couldn't. Their hand was forced not because of their current feelings and desires. It was dictated by the desire to be accountable.

The idea of creating a system of accountability for ourselves is one that can benefit our spiritual lives. Thinking about praying, and reading the Bible, and ending hunger, and being more welcoming is fine, but without action it doesn't do God, us, or others a bit of good.

Because even the best intentions are going to run up against obstacles and our own fatigue, I would encourage you to be bold and set goals for your own spiritual walk that involve either getting to know God better or blessing others. Then tell someone about it, not so you can receive praise, but so that when you get the opportunity to let those moments pass you by, you'll remember that someone's going to ask you about that.

And as for me, I'm going to read the book of Luke, hand write ten thank-you letters, and finish the Portland Marathon in 3:40.

I hope that this edition of the Messenger finds you all enjoying the first days of Fall. The various committee chairs along with the Finance Committee have been hard at work to review and adjust our operating budget, which we feel will put us in a stronger financial position. There have been some additional gifts that have helped tremendously. At this point we are holding off paying a portion of the apportionments & hope to catch up by the end of the year. As planned, we have used \$20,000.00 from the contingency fund and will be using an additional \$4,000.00 in November.

We cannot continue to rely on contingency dollars since the stock market is in the shape it is; no money has been moved from our investments to replenish either the Contingency fund or the Grant fund. Although we are doing better financially, we are a long way from a balanced budget, which we really need to get to.

Have you been looking at our financial information that Laura Dionne has been posting? Laura will be adding to this information, in poster size, the newest financial results. Your prayers, ideas and continued support strengthen our church & help us to fulfill our mission.
